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Venjamin Kaverins "Dva Kapitana" and the conceptualization of the Arctic as an Archive

The lecture wants to explore the mnemonic architecture of the popular soviet adventure novel Two Captains (Dva Kapitana, 1938-1944), in which memory is realized as a figural disposition of progenitors, successor and doubles and polar space their basis to reconstruct a destructed historical narrative. Ice does not represent the untouched and unstructured, but is the saving and preserving medium of (historical) truth.

Whereas the disposal of a natural arctic archive is intensifying the authenticity of the frozen documents and vestiges, the main character as a double is opening a field of affirmation and negation, of simulation, which is a dissimulation on duty of a ideological interpretation.

Based on observations of Kaverins novel I want to discuss the potential of spacial semantization of arctic regions to convey historical processes and ask, to what extend the model of successors and doubles is not just a model of polar exploration and a spacial practice, but also a practice within the archives itself.
