The Archive's Temperature: Knowledge Production and Distribution in the

Circumpolar landscapes

Together with Marko Pelihan I plan to investigate the problem of the cryosphere and archive at

the intersection of knowledge and pedagogy, with an emphasis on the Circumpolar territories and

Northern Hemisphere. We will begin with brief historical foray by Sven Spieker into the way in

which the archive organized scientific thinking in the 19th century, especially in biology (Rudolf

Virchow: "All facts are historical!"). Specifically, Spieker will be concerned with the relationship

between historicism, archives, and temperature (the laws of thermodynamics).

In a second step, Marko Peljhan will make a presentation focused on the collaborative efforts of

the Arctic Perspective Initiative, with a focus on the way in which archives intersect with local,

traditional and indigenous models of knowledge production and storage in the Circumpolar world.

We conclude with a brief dialogue juxtaposing the scientific and local and traditional knowledge

views and reflections of the notion of archive and its inherent value in todays Circumpolar

complexities with global implications.
