# SYMPOSIUM

# (RETRO) **AVANT-GARDE**

ART Between opiivion, and emancipation Between oblivion, nostalgia

The symposium will dialectically address the topic of emancipation in/of art within the context of the apparatus of capitalism and its material conditions. Despite being proclaimed as out-dated and even nostalgic to return to the avant-garde legacy, the participants are invited to trace consequences of its legacy within the recent and current artistic practices, which are found in various forms and political affiliations. One of the recurring consequences of the avant-garde art was evaluated through a "double rupture" which firstly took place within art itself, immanently, opening up new forms and aesthetical criteria, and secondly, in how far it was able

to undermine dominant art, even go against art and challenge the capitalist frame and bourgeois state. This "avant-garde" pulsating between (dis)appearance of art and politics evokes an old question of the borders of art-autonomy, but also extends into discussions of accelarationism, appopriationism, Rancierian politics of aesthetics, Groysian blockage of avant-garde, and others. The participants shall interrogate some of those theoretical positions and artistic strategies in order to respond to the question: what has remained from the "avant-garde" in art today?
